

and the Fun Zone was the place to be.



Volunteer Extraordinaire: That’s Sally Lutz, Our Friends of the Library “Special Lady”

How very fortunate we are to have Sally Lutz on our Volunteer Team! Sally exudes her love of books to all those about her. One usually would say that you can find the Library annex volunteers every Thursday morning shelving books. Well, Sally isn’t just any volunteer – you can stop by practically any day of the week and find her busy in her favorite sections: History and Biography. However, she can be found working away in almost any area, as her motto is “I’ll do whatever anyone else doesn’t seem to want to do.” That in itself makes Sally the outstanding volunteer she is.

Sally tried to retire from assisting FOL last year; however, she returned to us after her husband of 61 years, Jim Lutz, passed away. How she was missed that year! No, it wasn’t just because she had spoiled us by bringing treats every week.

As a young mother, Sally had been a “stay-at-home mom” to her three children. She had an opportunity to volunteer at a local school library, and that was a turning point. She said that she had never had so much fun in her life. It was this experience and her love of books that were the determining factors for her returning to college at San Jose State in order to study Library Science. Having graduated as a psychology major, it was a switch then to be credentialed as a school librarian.

Sally then, for 18 years, was School Librarian at Los Lomitas School district, retiring in 1983. Sally loved her “job.” She recalled that those were the days of the card catalogues, which she felt were important tools in “teaching habits of thought.”

Sally’s accolades continue with some

descriptive thoughts of her from a few of her fellow volunteers:

How the Friends of the Library Converts Your Donated Books into Funds to Support Our Library

In the 10 years since our new library building was opened, book donations from the San Carlos community have been our principal resource for generating money to help support the library's on-going operations and programs. Active volunteers from among the Friends of the Library process the donated books and then sell them in three venues:

At Monthly Sunday Book Sales

Typically, 130 to 150 people attend these popular sales held on the third Sunday each month from 1 to 4 pm in the Friends' "Annex" room on the second floor of the library. At an average sale, shoppers purchase around 1,350 books from our inventory of 14,000 volumes. These books are priced from 50 cents to two dollars.

At the In-Library Book Shop

The Book Shop, open during library hours, displays 1,500 books, most

selling for three dollars or less. Volunteers replenish the stock through out the week, with the greatest number of new books being added on Tuesday mornings. This convenient location attracts regular browsers with as many as 160 people per week finding items of interest. The Book Shop, which features the newest and best of the donated books, is our largest source of funds to support the library.

On the Internet

In addition to the books of general interest sold in the Book Shop and the Annex, we maintain an on-line book presence with ABEbooks.com. Here, more than 450 unusual donated books are listed at \$20 to \$400. These rare books are available to purchasers from all over the United States and other parts of the world.

Getting to Know... Arnie Miller, Founder of the San Carlos Library Knitters Club

I have been a local San Carlos resident for 8 years and I have become a fan of the library since I first moved to the area. I find the leisurely stroll to the quiet building relaxing and have volunteered to hold knitting classes.

I teach "Knitting With Arnie" on the first and third Wednesdays of the month; we meet from 6:30 to 9:00 PM. The wall hanging is a major project I just completed and asked the library if they were interested in hanging the art. We thought at first the Children's Librarians might object to our taking up a lot of wall space that they need for hanging pictures painted by kids, but now I find they have laid claims to the piece and don't want it moved.

The piece was inspired by my sister, who asked all knitting members of the family to knit one square for a blanket she was piecing together for her new daughter-in-law. The patterns depicted here are credited to Barbara G. Walker from "Charted Knitting Designs – A Third Treasury."

I am a data processing manager by vocation and am still employed by the US Postal Service. I manage the database that controls all the zip code and route information for the country.

Although introduced to knitting in Junior High School, and crocheting by my grandmother, I didn't seriously return to knitting until 1986. Since then, I've been avidly knitting for family and friends.
