Message from the President

Library Renovation Project

The initial design and cost model for the project have been agreed upon. There are several steps to come to finalize the plan and obtain detailed construction cost bids. The remaining issues are scheduled to be resolved by late summer.

The cost model of the renovation at this time is approximately \$1,400,000. Funding has been identified and pledged as follows:

San Mateo County Library System	\$400,000
Hofer Family Bequest Dedicated Grant	257,000
Friends of the San Carlos Library Dedicated Grant	275,000
City of San Carlos Building Fund	400,000
City of San Carlos Maintenance Fund and ARRA Grant	100,000 +/-

The \$275,000 grant from the Friends is the result of funds earned by selling donated used books through the Book Shop and the Third Sunday Sales for approximately 10 years. Our books range in price from 50 cents to \$3.00. The average sale is approximately \$1. The donation was achieved through the hard work of many volunteers, dedication to the library and community and last but not least love of books and learning.

Friends of the Library Assist Book-Lovers in Need through Book Recycling

Have you ever wondered what happens to the **donated books** that the Friends of the Library don't sell? Answer: They are recycled—to excellent causes, of course.

We are proud to have put in place a re-donation/recycling program that supports local and locally affiliated book-loving groups in need of donated books.

One of our most rewarding partnerships is with the Redwood City School District, where redonations have totaled more than

6,000 children's books in the last two years. To quote a thank-you letter from Alisa MacAvoy, Redwood City School District Board Trustee: "The principals and librarians at the school sites have been giving the books to the school libraries and to teachers to give out to students. Many of the students at these schools have very few books at home, so receiving a new, gently used book to keep is a real treat for the students and the family!"

Other re-donation recipients include: San Mateo County Juvenile Hall, Reading Partners, St. Vincent de Paul Society and the Basilan Library in the Philippines.

Book-Peddling on the Internet

Going to the bookshop located on the first floor of the library or attending the once-a-month Sunday book sales on the second floor is a fun way to find reading material for all ages. But if you have been looking for a particular book over a long period of time, you might want to consider going on the web. My favorite site is "Addall," which is basically a search engine for all online bookstores and dealers. Some booksellers actually price their books for as low as \$.01 (yes, one penny), but do consider

shipping (\$3.00 if shipped within the US). If you are looking for a one-time read, and don't care about the condition, a bookseller will describe the book as: "good reading copy," and the prices are extremely low.

The Friends of San Carlos Library also have a bookstore on the web. Our store is listed at Abebooks. We have more than 450 books in all categories, and our prices start at \$15 and go into the \$100s. Some of our bestsellers are textbooks. We started this endeavor in 2004, and we expect to be very close to \$20,000 in profits by the end of 2012. All proceeds go to the library programs, and now, also to the *Library Makeover* fundraising effort.
